Enjoy free tastings of our Chardonnay, Viognier, Cabernet Franc, and Petit Verdot. Celebrate the harvest with us as we release our 2008 Merlot.

**Directions:** From Leesburg, take Rt. 7 W to Purcellville. Exit at Rt. 287 and turn left. Turn right onto Hirst Rd. At the end of Hirst, turn right onto Hillsboro Road (Rt. 690). Go 2.9 miles and turn left onto Ashbury Church Road. Turn left onto Mountain Ridge Lane. First driveway on the left.

Enjoy a glass of lemonade and watch demonstrations of natural horsemanship throughout the day from the viewing platforms of the new indoor arena, or walk the grounds and see the horse-playgrounds. Take a copy of *Recipes from Rock Hill Farm*, tasty ideas utilizing the produce from the garden and fruit from the trees.

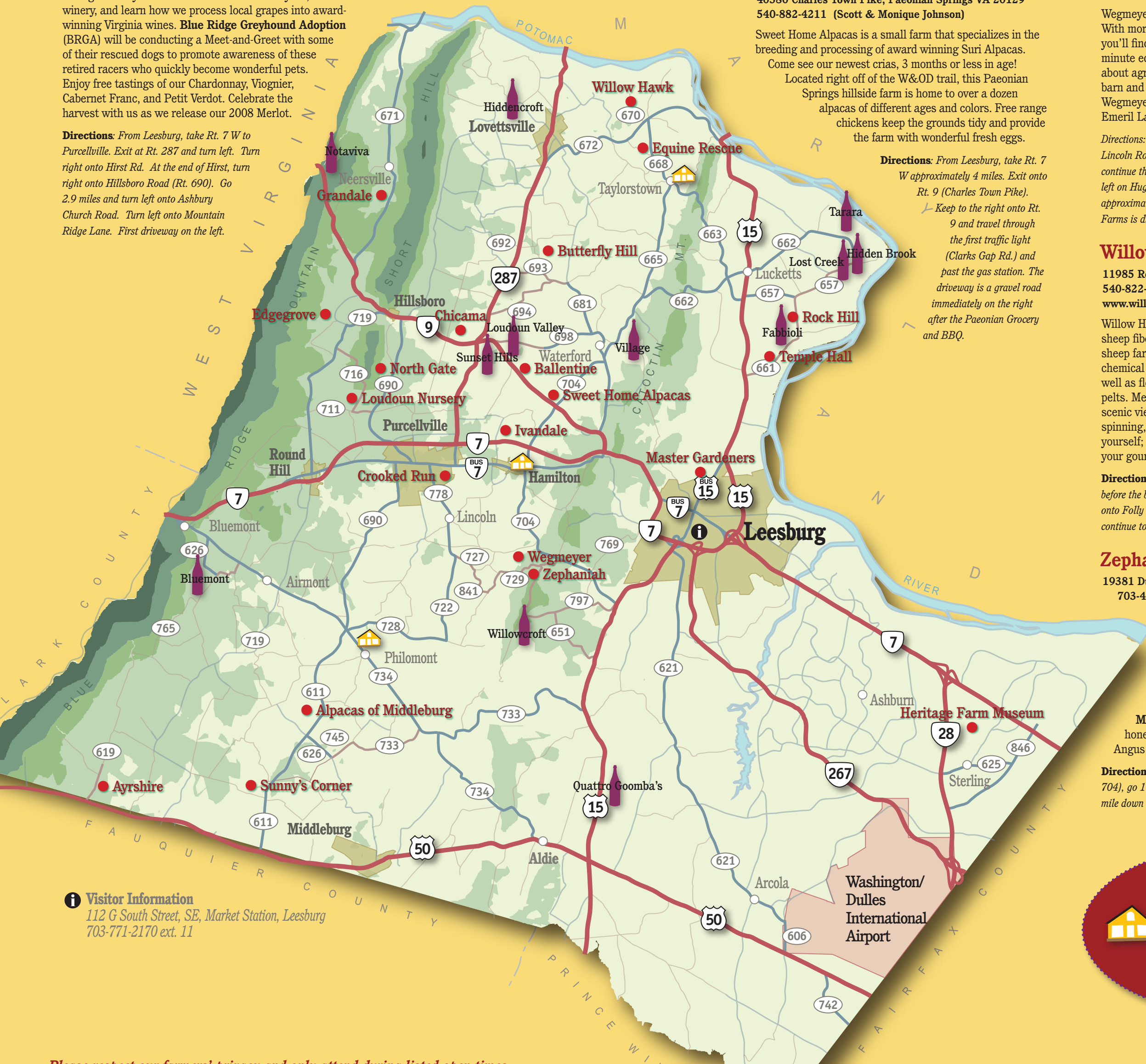
