




- Program provides up-front funding to full-time farmers to purchase farmland.


- Goals:

  - Preserve the Family Farm
  - Transition farmland to Full-time
     Farmers

# CRITICAL FARMS PROGRAM — Do I QUALIFY TO APPLY?

### Criterion (Land):

- Minimum of 50 acres unless adjoins another permanent easement property.
- Soil quality for agriculture
- Open contract of sale or ownership of land for less than 6 months
- Development potential (subdivision rights)

## CRITICAL FARMS PROGRAM-DO I QUALIFY TO APPLY?

## Criterion (Applicant)

• Full-time Farmer – earn a majority of income from farming during past 3 years.

Meets Applicant Criterion Tyler has been


### CRITICAL FARMS PROGRAM-HOW DOES IT WORK?

- 1. Applications collected by County and assigned rank
- 2. Boards recommend which applications to appraise (based on funding available)
- 3. Appraisals are contracted by the County to determine Critical Farms Option Value
- 4. Applicants given appraisals and asked to submit a bid for Option Value
- 5. Boards review bids to make offers (preference can be given to those submitting a discounted bid)
- 6. Offers Made- 30 days to accept or reject
- 7. If accepted, settlement scheduled

# CRITICAL FARMS OPTION AGREEMENT

- Legal document recorded at settlement (temporary preservation agreement)
- Option agreement requires landowner to apply to other permanent land preservation programs (Maryland Agricultural Land Preservation Foundation -MALPF) for 7 years
- When landowner receives offer from MALPF, first pays back Option value to County
- MALPF Easement recorded (permanent preservation)

# TYLER ENTERED CONTRACT AND APPLIED TO CRITICAL FARMS

- Critical Farms deadline August 16, 2013
- County received 7 applications on 860 acres
- Funding- the County had about \$2.1 Million available for offers
- County review/Approval
- Appraisals Ordered on all 7 applications
- Bids Accepted
- Offers on all 7 applications

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Frederick County, Maryland ("County"), adopted the Local Program For the Preservation of Critical Agricultural Land, Frederick County Code, §1-13-34 effective April 5, 1994 and as Amended effective Egbruary February 1, 2002 (hereinafter referred to as "Program");

WHEREAS, this Ordinance provides that an applicant for the Program may sell to the gainst the County an Option to Purchase (hereinafter referred to as "Option") an agricultural land preservation easement, prohibiting any development of the property (hereinafter referred to as "easement), while at the same time attempting to establish an agricultural preservation district on the property and convey this easement to the State Agricultural Land Preservation Foundation (hereinafter referred to as "Foundation") or other Governmental Land Preservation Programs as approved by the Board of County Commissioners, pursuant to the provisions of the Annotated Code of Maryland, Agricultural Article, Section 2-501 and following, as amended; and

WHEREAS, under the Program, the Option is to be purchased from the applicant for no more than seventy-five percent (75%) of the agreed upon value of the development rights (agricultural land preservation) easement. The Option is intended to remain in effect for a term of seven (7) years unless sooner terminated by the Seller in accordance herewith. If the Foundation or other Governmental Land Preservation Program purchases the easement during the term of the Option and the amount received by the applicant as payment for the Option is returned to the County, along with the notice required pursuant hereto, this Option



### CRITICAL FARMS PROGRAM-HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE?

6 months under perfect conditions

Need for flexible contract of sale

 Tyler applied August 16, 2013 and settled on the farm February 19, 2014.

#### **VALUE INFORMATION**

- •The Critical Farms Option Value is a maximum of 51% of Fair Market Value (Land Only) based on 2 appraisals.
- •Boards will also be reviewing the Contract Purchase Price

EXAMPLE:			
Contract Purchase Price:	\$1,250,000		
Appraised Fair Market Value (land only)	\$1,000,000		
Max.Critical Farms Option Value:	\$510,000		
Applicant's Discounted Bid/Offer:	\$475,000		
Max. State Easement Offer:	\$750,000		

#### **OPTION AGREEMENT**

If after Seven years no offer is obtained from MALPF the landowner has two choices:

1.) Pay back the Option Value to the County plus interest and all restrictions are removed from the property.

OR

2.) Allow the County to record a permanent Easement with no further payment.

### CRITICAL FARMS PROGRAM-ACCOMPLISHMENTS

• Completed 37 transactions to assist Full-time Farmers in acquiring farms

• Over 3,700 acres transitioned into permanent program and 1,049 acres in options today

 Revolving loan fund replenished as Option properties transition into permanent easements


