

## Soil Health Economic Case Study Tool Kit Terms of Use May 30, 2024

American Farmland Trust (AFT), with support from a 2018 USDA-NRCS Conservation Innovation Grant, developed methods to quantify the economic and water quality outcomes associated with soil health practices adopted by "soil health successful" row crop farmers or tree nut growers to feature in two-page case studies.

You may use these methods as guidelines to develop and conduct your own case studies examining the economic and environmental outcomes experienced by producers who have already adopted soil health practices in your region, modified as you deem necessary for your region, production system, or other variables.
