- **Purchase of Development Rights**
 - Funder and easement co-holder
 - Conserved 822 Farms, 176k acres
 - Match \$: NRCS ACEP-ALE
- **Farmland Access & Affordability**
 - Option to Purchase at Agricultural Value (OPAV)
 - Farm Viability
- **Water Resource Protection**
 - Special easement protections
 - Water Quality Grants
 - Farmland Retirement

- **Background**
 - Began in 2017
 - Retired 1,100 acres (5 farms)
 - Partners: TNC, VLT, VT Fish & Wildlife Department, VT Agency of Ag
- **Program Goals**
 - Improve water quality
 - Enhance climate resiliency
 - Restore habitat
 - Improve ag sustainability and viability
- **Funding**
 - Sources
 - Uses
 - Amount

Farmland Retirement Program

- **Minimum Eligibility Criteria**
 - Nonprofits, state, municipalities
 - All or portion of land
 - Demonstrate high degree of readiness
- **Secondary Criteria**
 - Habitat restoration
 - Enhance resources for wildlife
 - Climate resiliency
 - Public access
 - Support VHCB dual-goal mission
- **Funding Priorities**
 - Location
 - Leverage

Case Study: Farrow Farm



- 163-acre dairy farm in Morgan, VT
- Partners: The Nature Conservancy, VT Fish & Wildlife, VT Agency of Ag
- 7,500' stream frontage – high priority fisheries habitat in impaired watershed.
- Funds from VHCB, Great Lakes Fisheries Commission, VT Agency of Ag.
- Total budget: \$486,500 (VHCB funds \$250,000, leverage \$236,500)
- Recreation components

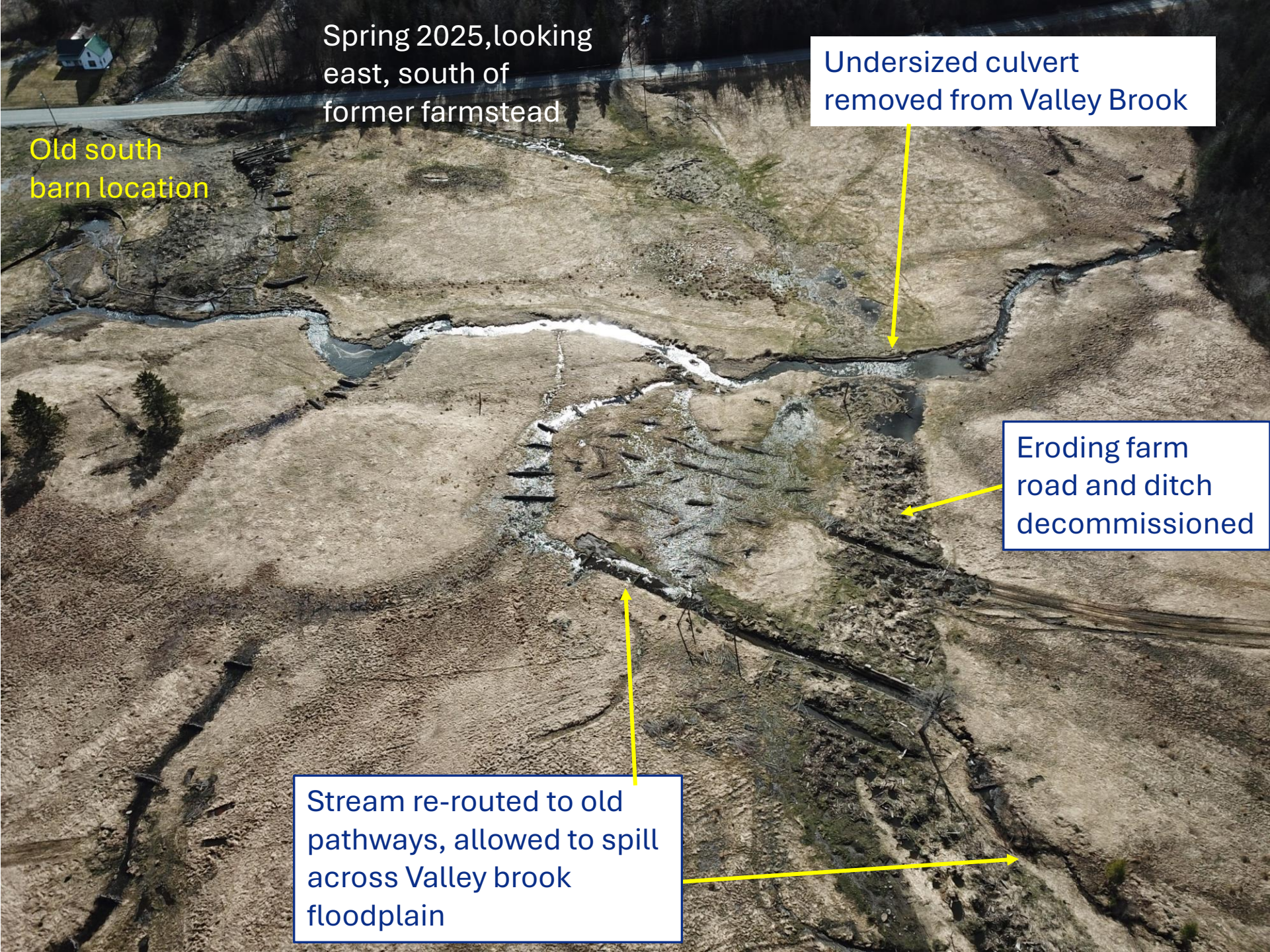

Undersized road culvert removed/replaced summer 2025.






